

Dear Commissioner Allen:

Thank you for your letter advising of the approval by the Board of Regents of an amendment to the Master Plans of the State University and the City University of New York to provide for an additional community college in New York City.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 of the Education Law, I hereby approve the addition of this college to the Master Plans of the State University and City University.

While providing general approval, however, I must note that many details of the proposed "Skills Center" are yet to be resolved between the City and State Universities to insure that no duplication exists between that Center and the State University's Urban Centers in New York City.
