PETITIONING! The Central Brooklyn Community wants Medgar Evers College to remain a four year instition. One way of showing this support of the College is through the collection of signatures on petitions. These petitions can be used in our lobbying efforts with Governor Carey and the State legislators in Albany. We have divided Brooklyn into sections to be canvased by teams between 12:00 noon and 4:00 p. m. Each team will consist of a driver and five other persons. Petitions must be returned to the College (Prep Room 219) before 5:00 p.m. in order that they can be taken to Albany on Tuesday. LOBBYING! On Tuesday (March 2), a group of Medgar Evers College faculty and students are going to Albany to convince State legislators that the intended action of closing the College must be stopped. A., a student to be designated, Andre McLaughlin, Tobin Barrozo, Roderick Loney, Hilda Richards, Wendell Clement, Don Watkins, Norman Johnson (NAACP), and a member of the Medgar Evers College Community Council.

BROOKLYN ACTION! In addition to lobbying, we must make it perfectly clear to the public that we will $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ accept a decision to make Medgar Evers College a junior college. To do this requires both publicity and a show of strength. We intend to demonstrate at Brooklyn College. Our position is that there will be $\underline{\text{no}}$ four-year CUNY college $\underline{\text{in Brooklyn}}$ unless Medgar Evers College remains a four-year institution.
